*National data show that 50% of students who started at the 6 PR were able to achieve a Moderate growth rate or better, while 25% were able to achieve an Ambitious growth rate or better. Set an appropriate goal and adjust as necessary.

Provides on-the-spot guidance for setting student goals.

Each score is reported as a Scaled Score (SS) and Percentile Rank (PR). The SS is the actual score a student received, while PR compares scores nationally to other students in the same grade.

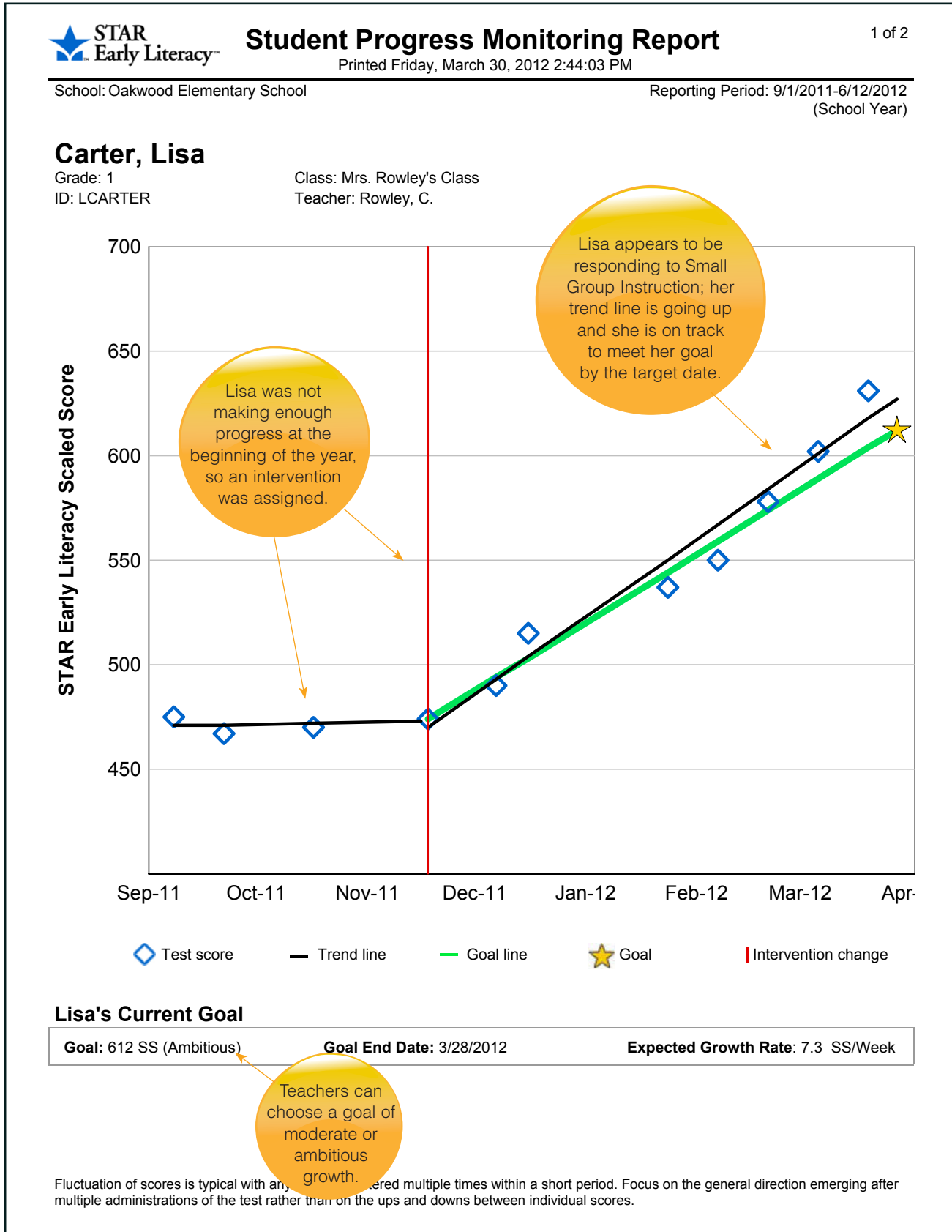
Teachers can select a moderate or ambitious goal for the student. Goals were derived from national data.

Use reference points based on Lisa's starting test to help select an appropriate goal.

After you set a goal, the software automatically plots progress toward that goal on the Student Progress Monitoring report.

Once there are four scores, the Growth Rate is automatically calculated, using all of the test scores available for the student.

Lisa responded positively to the intervention; her Growth Rate is exceeding her Expected Growth Rate.
