

# Setting Goals for Reports

## Faculty Quick Reference Guide



Goals for up to 14 different data measurements can be set up in myON. Setting a goal will show that goal on reports and also provide graphic visualizations to identify students below goal. myON doesn't require you to set any goals—reports without goals won't include highlighting students with activity that should be reviewed.

1. While in the Faculty account, select "Classroom."
2. Select "Reports."
3. Select "Goals" on the right.

Are your students' reading achievements where you want them to be? With new myON Goals you can gauge progress, accomplishments and room for improvement more quickly, easily—and always aligned to your personal expectations!

For each myON report, just set and save your goals below. Then run the report for new insights into how your students are performing. Your goals aren't shared with students directly and you can modify a goal anytime!

Curious if your goals line up with the whole school or district's? When Building and District Administrators set goals, teachers will be able to see them too.

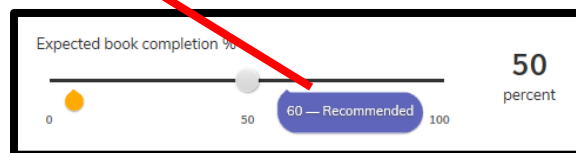

Because myON personalizes recommended reading, students have the opportunity to explore titles they may not have tried to read independently. The myON system average for the number of books opened versus those finished is 60%! What percent do you think your students will complete?



Once a goal has been set, that information will show up on the report. Additionally, student activity data will be color-coded to show those students below goal (in **red**), and those students at or above goal (in **green**).

The goals that can be set in myON include:

Goal	Description	Recommendation
% of Days with Reading	Over the past 14 days, how many days do you think your students should log in to myON to read?	myON recommends 70% (or 10 days out of every 14).
Average Minutes Reading per Week	How many minutes should students be active on myON each week? Research suggests that reading 20 minutes a day can improve reading ability and confidence.	myON recommends a goal of 140 minutes (20 minutes each day for 7 days).
Average Pages Per Week	Think about the format of books your students read on myON. Lower level informational text and picture books average 28-32 pages. Longer chapter books as well as higher reading level titles can be 48 pages or more!	myON recommends reading at least 25 pages each week.
Book Completion %	Because myON personalizes recommended reading, students have the opportunity to explore titles they may not have tried to read independently. What percent of books do you think your students will open and complete?	The myON system average for the number of books opened versus those finished is 60%!
Quiz Score Average	myON features comprehension quizzes that can be enabled for when students finish reading a book. These quizzes can measure understanding of the main idea, recall of supporting details, vocabulary, interpretation, and inference. On average, what percent do you think students should achieve on their comprehension quiz?	myON recommends an average score of 60% or higher.
Quiz Question Type Mastery %	myON features comprehension quizzes that can be enabled for when students finish reading a book. These quizzes can measure understanding of the main idea, recall of supporting detail, vocabulary, interpretation, and inference. On average, what do you think mastery looks like on each of these types of questions for your students?	myON recommends an average score of 80% or higher in each of these questions.
% Minutes Reading Independently, Out-of-School	As a digital platform with access from home and school, students can access myON anytime. How much of the time that students spend reading on myON do you think will be outside of school hours?	Data from myON system-wide suggests that at least 40% of reading will be outside of school hours.

% Minutes Reading On-Target at Lexile	Your students can elect to read books that are 100L below to 50L above their reading Lexile (known as on-target). Or, they can read books outside this target level. How many minutes do you think they should read at their target level?	Since reading on-target books will help grow reading ability and confidence more quickly in students, myON recommends that at least 80% of books read are in the target Lexile range.
Non-fiction Reading Time %	To be college or career ready, many academic standards promote reading non-fiction material. Non-fiction exposes students to critical ideas, vocabulary, and content. What percent of time do you think your students should spend reading non-fiction?	myON recommends 50% of the time students should be reading non-fiction.
% Reading without Audio	While educators can control if audio is available or disabled for users, students with audio available can also choose to read without audio. What percent of time do you think students should read without audio?	Since audio is such an important scaffold for struggling and reluctant readers (or even on-level readers accessing books outside of their Lexile range), myON recommends 10% or less.
Average Lexile Test Growth	Like many other skills, improvement in reading may not happen at a constant pace, so it's best to take a longer view of Lexile growth. Don't expect to see consistent growth each week but look instead for a positive trend.	myON recommends this be set to 5L.
1-year Lexile Growth Target	Research suggests that students in different grade levels can grow their reading level between 50 and 100L with targeted practice. Beginning readers grow their reading skills more quickly, so expect to see a larger growth target for students in elementary school (up to 100L per year).	The rate of reading growth decreases as students become more accomplished readers. A reader who has a higher reading level can expect to grow between 40L and 60L over the course of a year.
Average News Reading Minutes per Week	While reading the news is still reading, news articles promote different types of growth. Awareness of current events and combatting "fake news" are just a few of the benefits that students get from the news. How many minutes each week do you want your students to engage with news articles?	myON recommends at least 20 minutes a week reading the news.
News reading frequency (days reading %)	News articles can promote understanding of different viewpoints and awareness of current events. myON News publishes 5 articles each weekday and includes special editions with breaking news. What percent of days during your reporting period do you want your students to read the news?	myON recommends that 40% of the days during the reporting period (or 6 out of 14) include reading the news.

The District Administrator and Building Administrator can also set goals that are visible to Faculty.
